Answer: B. A \$5 bill is fungible

Every \$5 bill is always going to be worth \$5, so it's fungible – meaning, it's "mutually interchangeable." Bitcoin (and other forms of crypto) is also fungible because each one is worth the exact same amount. A used car is non-fungible because no other car holds the exact same value, even one with the same make, model and number of miles.

## 2. What factors are most likely to influence the value of an NFT?

Both B and C

Answer: D. Both B and C

Supply and demand will generally dictate the price of an NFT, so if there's only one version and thousands of people want it, the price will be driven up because it's exclusive. Additionally, the social power of a celebrity, artist or other pop-culture icon can cause an increase in perceived value. (Who wouldn't want to own something of Golden Girls' Betty White, an American treasure?! Not that I've thought about it, of course ...)

## 3. It's easy to counterfeit an NFT.

Answer: B. False

NFTs are digitally authenticated as original assets (in this case, digital files) and are impossible to replicate because they each have their own unique, identifiable codes.
